Prior to his time at RVU, Dr. Forstein most recently served as Dean and Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology (OB/GYN) at Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine – Harlem, New York Campus. He has also served as Residency Director and

Associate Professor of OB/GYN at the University of South Carolina School of Medicine – Greenville, as Clerkship Director at Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM), and as Vice-Chair of Clinical Operations for the department of OB/GYN at the Greenville Health System.

Dr. Forstein is currently the Chair of the American Osteopathic Association's Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation and serves on the Board of Directors of the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education. He is Board-certified in both OBG/GYN and reproductive endocrinology and infertility.
